Projects

Don discussed the various projects planned for the summer, including infrastructure. In addition, Don discussed the different funds that are available to fund these projects, citing the Woodside B-wing cracking problem as an example of how monies from the state and measure V would most likely cover the cost. Don also announced that the first payment (\$33M) of Measure G bond money was just deposited.

Don went over the projects by school requiring oversight committee approval. On a motion from Bob Eppler, seconded by Dale Williams the following projects were unanimously approved by the committee as follows:

Sequoia:

- Upgrade High Voltage \$375,000
- New Package Boiler \$60,000
- Relocation of Sewer Lines \$100,000
- Possible High-Tech-High \$50,000

Menlo Atherton:

- Fire Alarm System \$75,000
- Student Green \$100,000
- Entrance/Hallway Old Gym \$100,000
- Traffic Flow/Aesthetics \$50,000 (planning work only)
- Two New Classrooms \$500,000
- Computers for New Library \$35,000
- Renovate Faculty Lounge and Work Area \$50,000

Carlmont:

- High Voltage/Power Transformer/Switch Gear \$650,000
- Upgrade Electrical Panels \$250,000
- New Gas Lines/Furnace/Boiler \$400,000
- New Main Sewer and Wing Lateral Replacement \$200,000
- Update Irrigation and Fire Water System \$500,000

Woodside:

- Performing Arts Center \$12M (Approve addition \$1M)
- Infrastructure-Utility Upgrades \$500,000

Redwood:

- Restroom Renovation \$60,000
- Classroom Modernization \$200,000
- Administration Re-design and Renovation \$250,000
- Infrastructure as needed. \$75,000
- Landscape/Hardscape Graduation Area w/ Stage & ADA Ramps \$15,000
