SUHSD Reclassification to Fluent English Proficiency for the 2015-2016 School Year

In order for a SUHSD student to be reclassified as Fluent English Proficient (RFEP) during the 2015-16 school year, he/she must meet the following criteria:

- 1. Assessment of English Language Proficiency: California English Language Development Test (CELDT)
 - a. Overall proficiency level of 5 (Advanced) or 4 (Early Advanced), and
 - b. A minimum score of 4 (Early Advanced) in all sub-tests
- 2. Teacher evaluation:
 - a. Recommendation from an English teacher and/or Bilingual Resource Teacher
- 3. Parent Opinion and Consultation:
 - a. Input from the parent/guardian of English Learner regarding recommendation for Reclassification to Fluent English Proficiency
- 4. Assessment of basic skills in English-language arts: Gates McGinitie Reading Test (GMRT) or California High School Exit Exam (CAHSEE)-Overall scores as follows:
 - a. 9th Grade: minimum 7.5 reading level on the incoming 9th Grade GMRT
 - b. 10th Grade: minimum 8.5 reading level or higher on end of 9th grade GMRT
 - c. 11th Grade: minimum 9.5 reading level on 10th grade GMRT or 350 or higher on last CAHSEE/ELA
 - d. 12th Grade: minimum 9.5 reading level or higher on most recent GMRT or 350 or higher on last CAHSEE/ELA

California Department of Education Academic Criterion for Reclassification

August 11, 2014

For the 2014-15 school year, three of the four reclassification criteria remain unchanged:

- 1. Assessment of English language proficiency, using an objective assessment instrument, including but not limited to, the state test of English language development
- 2. Teacher evaluation, including but not limited to, a review of the student's curriculum mastery
- 3. Parent opinion and consultation

The fourth criterion requires a comparison of student performance on an objective assessment of basic skill in English-language arts. The assessment results must have an empirically established range of performance in basic skills based on the performance of English proficient students of the same age.

 - a. Aporte de los padres/tutores legales de estudiantes aprendices del inglés sobre la recomendación para reclasificación a dominio total de inglés
- 4. Evaluación de habilidades básicas in Lenguaje y Literatura en Inglés: **Prueba de Lectura** *Gates McGinitie* (GMRT) o Examen de Egreso de la Preparatoria de California (CAHSEE) lo puntajes totales son los siguientes:
 - a. Grado 9: mínimo de 7.5 nivel de lectura en el GMRT para estudiantes ingresando al 9^{no} grado
 - b. Grado 10: mínimo de 8.5 nivel de lectura o más alto en el GMRT al final del 9^{no} grado
 - c. Grado 11: mínimo de 9.5 nivel de lectura en el GMRT del 10^{mo} grado o 350 o más alto en el último CAHSEE/ELA
 - d. Grado 12: mínimo de 9.5 nivel de lectura o más alto en el más reciente GMRT o 350 o más alto en el último CAHSEE/EL

Departamento de Educación de California Criterio Académico para Reclasificación 11 de agosto del 2014

Para el año escolar 2014-15, tres de los cuatro criterios de reclasificación se mantienen sin cambios:

- 1. Evaluación del dominio del idioma inglés, utilizando un instrumento de evaluación objetiva, incluyendo pero no limitado a, a la prueba estatal del desarrollo del idioma inglés
- 2. La evaluación del maestro, incluyendo pero no limitado a, una revisión del dominio del plan de estudios del estudiante
- 3. Opinión y contribución de los padres

El cuarto criterio requiere una comparación del rendimiento del estudiante en una evaluación objetiva de habilidades básicas en lenguaje y literatura en inglés. Los resultados de la evaluación deben tener un rango de rendimiento empíricamente establecido en habilidades básicas de competencia en inglés de estudiantes de la misma edad.

SEQUOIA UNION HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR SERVICES AGREEMENT

This INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR SERVICES AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is made and entered into effective December 1 , 20 15 (the "Effective Date"), by and between the Sequoia Union High School District ("District") and Invo Healthcare Associates ("Contractor").

- 1. <u>Contractor Services.</u> In consideration of the payments set forth herein and in Exhibit B, Contractor shall perform services for the District in accordance with the terms, conditions, and specifications set forth herein and in Exhibit A.
- 2. <u>Contractor Qualifications.</u> Contractor represents and warrants to District that Contractor and all of Contractor's employees, agents or volunteers (the "Contractor Parties") have in effect and shall maintain in full force throughout the Term of this Agreement all licenses, credentials, permits and any other legal qualifications required by law to perform the Services and to fully and faithfully satisfy all of the terms set forth in this Agreement.
- 3. <u>Term.</u> This Agreement shall begin on <u>December 10</u>, 20 15, and shall terminate upon completion of the Services, but no later than <u>June 17</u>, 20 16 ("Term"), unless the Agreement is terminated sooner as set forth in <u>Paragraph 4</u> below. There shall be no extension of the Term of this Agreement unless the extension is pursuant to a duly executed written amendment to this Agreement.
- 4. <u>Termination</u>. Either party may terminate this Agreement at any time by giving thirty (30) days advance written notice to the other party; however the parties may agree in writing to a shorter time period for the effectiveness of such termination. The District's Superintendent or the Superintendent's designee shall have the authority to terminate this Agreement on behalf of the District. Notwithstanding the foregoing, District may terminate this Agreement effective immediately and at any time by giving written notice to Contractor if Contractor materially breaches any of the terms of this Agreement, Contractor or the Contractor Parties commits any act or omission that exposes District to potential liability or may cause an increase in District's insurance premiums, Contractor is adjudged a bankrupt, Contractor makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors, or a receiver is appointed on account of Contractor's insolvency. Such termination shall be effective immediately upon Contractor's receipt of said notice.
- 5. Availability of funds. The District may terminate this Agreement or a portion of the services referenced in the Attachments and Exhibits based upon unavailability of federal, state, or district funds, by providing written notice to Contractor as soon as is reasonably possible after the District learns of said unavailability of outside funding.
- 6. Payment. In consideration of the Services described in this Agreement, District agrees to pay Contractor at the rate of \$85. per hr, as described in Exhibit B to this Agreement. The rate shall not be increased by Contractor over the course of this Agreement unless set forth in a duly executed written amendment to this Agreement. Total payment by District to Contractor shall not exceed \$75,225. District agrees to pay Contractor within sixty (60) days of receipt of an invoice from Contractor in a form reasonably acceptable to the District, including any additional supporting documentation reasonably requested by District. Any work performed by Contractor in excess of said amount shall not be compensated.
- 7. Indemnity. Contractor shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless District and its agents, representatives, officers, consultants, employees, Board of Trustees, and members of the Board of Trustees (collectively, the "District Parties"), from and against any and all claims, demands, liabilities, damages, losses, suits and actions, and expenses (including, but not limited to attorney fees and costs including fees of consultants) of any kind, nature and description (collectively, the "Claims") directly or indirectly arising out of, connected with, or resulting from any act, error, omission, negligence, or willful misconduct of Contractor, the Contractor Parties or their respective agents, subcontractors, employees, material or equipment suppliers, invitees, or licensees in the performance of or failure to perform Contractor's obligations under this

Agreement, including, but not limited to Contractor's or the Contractor Parties' use of the site, Contractor's or the Contractor Parties' performance of the Services, Contractor's or the Contractor Parties' breach of any of the representations or warranties contained in this Agreement, or for injury to or death of persons or damage to property or delay or damage to the District or the District Parties. Such obligation shall not be construed to negate, abridge, or reduce other rights or obligations of indemnity, which would otherwise exist as to a party, person, or entity described in this paragraph.

The duty of Contractor to indemnify and save harmless as set forth by this Section shall include the duty to defend as set forth in Section 2778 of the California Civil Code.

- 8. Equipment and Materials. Contractor at its sole cost and expense shall provide and furnish all tools, labor, materials, equipment, transportation services and any other items (collectively, "Equipment") which are required or necessary to perform the Services in a manner which is consistent with generally accepted standards of the profession for similar services. Notwithstanding the foregoing, District shall not be responsible for any damages to persons or property as a result of the use, misuse or failure of any Equipment used by Contractor of the Contractor Parties, even if such Equipment is furnished, rented or loaned to Contractor or the Contractor Parties by District. Furthermore, any Equipment or workmanship that does not conform to the regulations of this Agreement may be rejected by District and in such case must be promptly remedied or replaced by Contractor at no additional cost to District and subject to District's reasonable satisfaction.
- 9. Insurance. Without in any way limiting Contractor's liability or indemnification obligations set forth in Paragraph 6 above, Contractor shall secure and maintain throughout the term of this Agreement the following insurance: (i) comprehensive general liability insurance with limits of not less than \$1,000,000.00 each occurrence and \$2,000,000.00 in the aggregate; (ii) commercial automobile liability insurance with limits not less than \$1,000,000.00 each occurrence and \$2,000,000.00 in the aggregate, if applicable; and (iii) worker's compensation insurance as required by Labor Code section 3200, et seq., if applicable; and neither Contractor nor any of the Contractor Parties shall commence performing any portion of the Services until all required insurance has been obtained and certificates indicating the required coverages have been delivered to and approved by District. All insurance policies shall include an endorsement stating that District and District Parties are named additional insureds. All of the policies shall be amended to provide that the insurance shall not be suspended, voided, canceled, reduced in coverage or in limits except after thirty (30) days' prior written notice has been given to District. If any of the required insurance is not reinstated, District may, at its sole option, terminate this Agreement. All of the policies shall also include an endorsement stating that it is primary to any insurance or self-insurance maintained by District and shall waive all rights of subrogation against District and/or the District Parties. A copy of the declarations page of Contractor's insurance policies shall be attached to this Agreement as proof of insurance.
- 10. <u>Independent Contractor Status.</u> Contractor, in the performance of this Agreement, shall be and act as an independent contractor. Contractor understands and agrees that s/he and the Contractor Parties shall not be considered officers, employees, agents, partners, or joint ventures of District, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided to employees of District and/or to which District's employees are normally entitled.
- 11. Taxes. All payments made by District to Contractor pursuant to this Agreement shall be reported to the applicable federal and state taxing authorities as required. District will not withhold any money from compensation payable to Contractor, including FICA (social security), state or federal unemployment insurance contributions, or state or federal income tax or disability insurance. Contractor shall assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, state and local taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to Contractor and the Contractor Parties and otherwise in connection with this Agreement.
- 12. <u>Fingerprinting/Criminal Background Investigation Certification.</u> Contractor and the Contractor Parties shall at all times comply with the fingerprinting and criminal background investigation requirements of the

- 14. <u>Labor Code.</u> Contractor shall comply with all applicable provisions of the Labor Code, Section §1720-1861, AB 1506 and the District's Labor Compliance Program, State of California (prevailing wages). Approved wage scales are on the internet at www.dir.ca.gov
- 15. <u>Confidential Information.</u> Contractor shall maintain the confidentiality of and protect from unauthorized disclosure any and all individual student information received from the District, including but not limited to student names and other identifying information. Contractor shall not use such student information for any purpose other than providing Services under this Agreement. Upon termination of this Agreement, Contractor shall turn over to District all educational records related to the Services provided to any District student pursuant to this Agreement.
- 16. <u>Assignment/Successors and Assigns.</u> Contractor shall not assign or transfer by operation of law or otherwise any of its rights, burdens, duties or obligations under this Agreement without the prior written consent of District, which consent shall be provided at the District's sole discretion. Subject to the foregoing, this Agreement shall be binding on the heirs, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns of the respective parties.
- 17. <u>Severability.</u> If any provision of this Agreement shall be held invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not invalidate or render unenforceable any other provision of this Agreement.
- 18. <u>Amendments.</u> The terms of this Agreement shall not be waived, altered, modified, supplemented or amended in any manner whatsoever except by written agreement signed by both parties.
- 19. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California, excluding its choice of law rules. Any action or proceeding seeking any relief under or with respect to this Agreement shall be brought solely in the Superior Court of the State of California for the County of San Mateo, subject to transfer of venue under applicable State law, provided that nothing in this Agreement shall constitute a waiver of immunity to suit by the District.
- 20. Written Notice. Written notice shall be deemed to have been duly served if delivered in person to Contractor at the address located next to the party signatures below, or if delivered at or sent by registered or certified mail to the last business address known to the person who sends the notice.
- 21. Compliance with laws: Payment of Permits/Licenses. All services to be performed by Contractor pursuant to this Agreement shall be performed in accordance with all applicable federal, state, district, and municipal laws, including, but not limited to, the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPPA) and the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA), and all federal regulations promulgated thereunder, as amended, and the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, as amended, and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, and the Individuals With Disabilities Education Act, as amended. Such services shall also be performed in accordance with all applicable ordinances, regulations, policies and procedures of the District and its governing board.

In the event of a conflict between the terms of this Agreement and federal, state, district, or municipal law or regulations, the requirements of the applicable law will take precedence over the requirements set forth in this Agreement.

Contractor will timely and accurately complete, sign, and submit all necessary documentation of compliance.

Contractor shall comply with all state fingerprint laws, including Education Code 45125.1.

22. Retention of Records, Right to Monitor and Audit.

- (a) CONTRACTOR shall maintain all required records for three (3) years after the DISTRICT makes final payment and all other pending matters are closed, and shall be subject to the examination and/or audit of the District, a Federal grantor agency, and the State of California.
- (b) Reporting and Record Keeping: CONTRACTOR shall comply with all program and fiscal reporting requirements set forth by appropriate Federal, State and local agencies, and as required by the DISTRICT.
- (c) CONTRACTOR agrees to provide to DISTRICT, to any federal or state department having monitoring or review authority, to DISTRICT's authorized representatives, and/or their appropriate audit agencies upon reasonable notice, access to and the right to examine all records and documents necessary to determine compliance with relevant Federal, State, and local statutes, rules and regulations, and this Agreement, and to evaluate the quality, appropriateness and timeless of services performed.
- Non-Discrimination. Contractor shall ensure equal employment opportunity based on objective standards of recruitment, classification, selection, promotion, compensation, performance evaluation, and management relations for all employees under this Agreement. Contractor's equal employment policies shall be made available to District upon request. There shall be no discrimination against any person under this Agreement because of race, color, national origin, age, ancestry, age, disability (physical or mental), religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, marital or domestic partner status, political beliefs or affiliation, familial or parental status (including pregnancy), medical condition (cancer-related), military service, or genetic information of such persons. Further, Contractor shall comply with Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, which provides that no otherwise qualified handicapped individual shall, solely by reason of a disability, be excluded from the participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination in the performance of this Agreement. This Section applies only to contractors who are providing services to members of the public under this Agreement.
- 24. <u>Attorney Fees.</u> If any legal action is taken to enforce the terms of this Agreement, each party shall bear its own legal expenses related to such action.
- 25. <u>Liability of District.</u> Notwithstanding anything stated herein to the contrary, District shall not be liable for any special, consequential, indirect or incidental damages, including but not limited to lost profits in connection with this Agreement.
- 26. Time. Time is of the essence to this Agreement.
- Waiver. No delay or omission by District in exercising any right under this Agreement shall operate as a waiver of that or any other right and no single or partial exercise of any right shall preclude the District from any or further exercise of any right or remedy.
- 28. Entire Agreement. This Agreement, including Exhibits and Attachments attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, is intended by the parties as the final expression of their agreement with respect to such terms as are included herein and as the complete and exclusive statement of its terms and may not be contradicted by evidence of any prior agreement or of a contemporaneous oral agreement, nor explained or supplemented by evidence of consistent additional terms.
- 29. <u>Ambiguity.</u> The parties to this Agreement, and each of them, hereby represent that the language contained herein is to be construed as jointly proposed and jointly accepted, and in the event of any subsequent determination of ambiguity, all parties shall be treated as equally responsible for such ambiguity.
- 30. <u>Execution of Other Documents.</u> The parties to this Agreement shall cooperate fully in the execution of any and all other documents and in the completion of any additional actions that may be necessary or

- appropriate to give full force and effect to the terms and intent of this Agreement.
- 31. Execution in Counterparts/Authority and Electronic Signatures. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts such that the signatures may appear on separate signature pages. The parties agree that this Agreement may be negotiated, concluded and consummated by electronic means and that electronic forms of signature, including facsimiles, are acceptable and valid. A copy, facsimile, or an original, with all signatures appended together, shall be deemed a fully executed agreement.
- 32. <u>Warranty of Authority.</u> The persons indicated below are legally authorized to execute this Agreement on behalf of the respective parties, and to bind the respective parties to this Agreement.



At the request of yourself and Louise Pacheco we are providing this proposal for Temporary Housing at Redwood High School in association with our ongoing Classroom Building and Multi-Purpose Room project. We anticipate that the construction cost for this project will be approximately \$450,000. The scope of work for the project includes the following components:

- Re-location of 1 or more existing portable classrooms to new locations on the south side of campus with above grade foundations.
- Location of up to 4 new temporary portable classrooms and one temporary restroom building on the south side of campus with above grade foundations.
- Design and coordination of ramps and/or decks as necessary for portable classroom buildings.
- Design of the temporary Fire Alarm and Telecom / Clock-Speaker Systems in the new and re-located portable classrooms.
- Design and installation of a temporary food service canteen.
- Additional site lighting as necessary to provide adequate lighting to meet code requirements. . It is assumed that as much exterior lighting as possible will be provided

from the sides of each building, however, it is expected that some additional pole mounted lighting may also be required.

- Minor interior modifications to the Adult School portable classroom building and existing Principal's Office.
- Grading, paving and tree removal as necessary to prepare the site for the temporary facilities.
- Re-location and construction of temporary utilities to serve these facilities, including

Compensation: For this project we propose a time and materials fee of 10% of estimated construction costs for Basic Services. We also propose additional fees for Food Service and for Electrical Engineering related to the temporary re-location of low voltage systems; these services will be provided at a Not to Exceed Fee of \$13,200. NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND ORDERED that for all public projects subject to Public Contract Code section 20111.6, no bids will be accepted from, and no contracts awarded to bidders or mechanical, electrical, or plumbing contractors who have not been pre-qualified pursuant to the District's prequalification process.

IT IS FURTHER DETERMINED AND ORDERED that, effective for 2016, bidders shall be pre-qualified in accordance with the requirements set forth in the pre-qualification process for the Sequoia Union High School District, adopted by this resolution, and attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibits A and B.

Per the recent site visit and information provided, we propose to supply the material, labor, and equipment necessary to install approximately 200 L/F of 34'11" tall poles and netting on the left field line at Woodside High School. Poles will be new painted steel designed and engineered for local wind conditions. Netting will be Redden #36 knotted UV treated nylon baseball netting with sewn in perimeter, vertical, and horizontal rope with heavy duty attachment hardware. The netting will attach start at the existing 50 foot tall pole (not engineered) and run down the left field line attaching to the top of the existing fencing, backstop, and dugouts where applicable. All new cable will be 3/8" and 5/16" extra high strength galvanized. Hardware will be 3/8" heavy duty galvanized and we will also provide and install all pertinent miscellaneous attachments for a complete installation. We are a California licensed Contractor and prevailing wages, California Stamped structural engineering (non DSA) and all applicable state and local taxes are included in this proposal. SB-359 California Mathematics Placement Act of 2015. (2015-2016)

Senate Bill No. 359

CHAPTER 508

An act to add Section 51224.7 to the Education Code, relating to pupil instruction.

[Approved by Governor October 05, 2015. Filed with Secretary of State October 05, 2015.]

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 359, Mitchell. California Mathematics Placement Act of 2015.

(1) Existing law establishes a system of public elementary and secondary education in this state, and authorizes local educational agencies throughout the state to provide instruction to pupils.

This bill would enact the California Mathematics Placement Act of 2015. The bill would require governing boards or bodies of local educational agencies, as defined, that serve pupils entering grade 9 and that have not adopted a fair, objective, and transparent mathematics placement policy as of January 1, 2016, to, before the beginning of the 2016–17 school year, develop and adopt, in a regularly scheduled public meeting, a fair, objective, and transparent mathematics placement policy for pupils entering grade 9 with specified elements, and would authorize governing boards or bodies of local educational agencies serving pupils who are transitioning between elementary and middle school or elementary and junior high school to develop and implement a mathematics placement policy for these pupils, as applicable, with these specified elements. The bill would further require each governing board or body of a local educational agency to ensure that its mathematics placement policy is posted on its Internet Web site. By imposing additional requirements on local educational agencies, the bill would impose a state-mandated local program.

(2) The California Constitution requires the state to reimburse local agencies and school districts for certain costs mandated by the state. Statutory provisions establish procedures for making that reimbursement.

This bill would provide that, if the Commission on State Mandates determines that the bill contains costs mandated by the state, reimbursement for those costs shall be made pursuant to these statutory provisions.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The Legislature finds and declares all of the following:

- (a) Pupil achievement in mathematics is important to prepare pupils for college and their future careers, especially those careers in the fields of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM).
- (b) Placement in appropriate mathematics courses is critically important for a pupil during his or her middle and high school years. A pupil's 9th grade math course placement is a crucial crossroads for his or her future educational success. Misplacement in the sequence of mathematics courses creates a number of barriers and

results in pupils being less competitive for college admissions, including admissions at the California State University and University of California.

- (c) The most egregious examples of mathematics misplacement occur with successful pupils and, disproportionately, with successful pupils of color. These successful pupils are achieving a grade of "B" or better, or are testing at proficient or even advanced proficiency on state assessments. Nevertheless, they are held back to repeat 8th grade mathematics coursework rather than advancing to the next course in the recommended mathematics course sequence.
- (d) Mathematics misplacement has far-reaching impacts on a pupil's confidence, general knowledge of mathematical concepts, and high school experience, and may also impact the college career opportunities available to the pupil.
- (e) New research shows that it is less common for pupils of color, even high-achieving pupils of color, to reach calculus by grade 12 compared to their white and Asian peers.
- (f) All pupils, regardless of race, ethnicity, gender, or socioeconomic background, deserve an equal chance to advance in mathematics.
- (g) With the shift towards implementation of the Common Core State Standards for Mathematics, it is particularly important for all pupils to have access to high-quality mathematics programs that meet the goals and expectations of these standards.
- (h) It is crucial for teachers and guidance personnel to advise pupils and parents on the importance of accurate mathematics course placement and its impact on future college eligibility so pupils may take each course in the mathematics course sequence.
- (i) California faces a looming shortage of college-educated workers in an increasingly competitive global economy.
- (j) A policy for correct mathematics placement must be addressed in order to ensure a fair process and chance of success for all pupils.
- **SEC. 2.** Section 51224.7 is added to the Education Code, to read:
- 51224.7. (a) This act shall be known, and may be cited, as the California Mathematics Placement Act of 2015.
- (b) Governing boards or bodies of local educational agencies that serve pupils entering grade 9 and that have not adopted a fair, objective, and transparent mathematics placement policy, as described in paragraphs (1) to (5), inclusive, as of January 1, 2016, shall, before the beginning of the 2016–17 school year, develop and adopt, in a regularly scheduled public meeting, a fair, objective, and transparent mathematics placement policy for pupils entering grade 9 that does all of the following:
- (1) Systematically takes multiple objective academic measures of pupil performance into consideration. For purposes of this paragraph, "objective academic measures" means measures, such as statewide mathematics assessments, including interim and summative assessments authorized pursuant to Section 60640, placement tests that are aligned to state-adopted content standards in mathematics, classroom assignment and grades, and report cards.
- (2) Includes at least one placement checkpoint within the first month of the school year to ensure accurate placement and permit reevaluation of individual pupil progress.
- (3) Requires examination of aggregate pupil placement data annually to ensure that pupils who are qualified to progress in mathematics courses based on their performance on objective academic measures selected for inclusion in the policy pursuant to paragraph (1) are not held back in a disproportionate manner on the basis of their race, ethnicity, gender, or socioeconomic background. The local educational agency shall report the aggregate results of this examination to the governing board or body of the local educational agency.
- (4) Offers clear and timely recourse for each pupil and his or her parent or legal guardian who questions the pupil's placement.
- (5) For nonunified school districts, addresses the consistency of mathematics placement policies between elementary and high school districts.

- (c) Governing boards or bodies of local educational agencies serving pupils who are transitioning between elementary and middle school or elementary and junior high school may develop and implement a mathematics placement policy for these pupils, as applicable, that satisfies paragraphs (1) to (5), inclusive, of subdivision (b).
- (d) Each governing board or body of a local educational agency shall ensure that its mathematics placement policy is posted on its Internet Web site.
- (e) For purposes of this section, "local educational agency" means county office of education, school district, state special school, or charter school.
- **SEC. 3.** If the Commission on State Mandates determines that this act contains costs mandated by the state, reimbursement to local agencies and school districts for those costs shall be made pursuant to Part 7 (commencing with Section 17500) of Division 4 of Title 2 of the Government Code.
