Ways to Obtain an EL Authorization

The State of California requires that all English learners (ELs) must be taught by certificated teachers with the appropriate English learner (EL) authorization or

by teachers currently participating in an approved training program to receive certification.

Option I: CTEL Exam (formerly CLAD Exam)

- This options includes taking the 3 sub-tests of the CTEL (California Teacher of English Learners)
- Exam is offered four times a year (Two in the Spring and two in the Fall)
 - o Registration opens in late August
- CTEL test review is available through the District or the County Office
 - o District Training includes a review of exam and training guides.
 - o County Training includes in-depth training and training guides. Registration fees apply. Please refer to website for details. http://www.smcoe.kl2.ca.us
- Teacher is responsible for paying test fees

Option 2: University Coursework

- 12 units of college course work must be completed to obtain an EL Authorization
- Courses may be completed at university campus, online, or through independent study
- Teacher is responsible for paying course fees.

Option 3: University Coursework and CTEL Exam

- You may combine CTEL exam with university coursework upon approval from the IHE
- You have passed one or more CTEL examinations combined with completed course work determined by a CTC-approved CTEL program at a regionally accredited college or university

- Teacher is responsible for paying test fees

Option 4: Education Specialist Level II Credential (EL Coursework)

- As of January 2007, Education Specialist Credential programs will be offering the R359, an EL Authorization embedded in the Level II credential.
- Special Education teachers who need to complete the Level II program may complete additional courses to obtain the EL Authorization.
