Subject: *Four Corners Traffic Study* – Alternatives Analysis Summary

Following is the results of our technical analysis of the corridor alternatives for the *Four Corners Traffic Study*.

Transportation Issues

As part of our analysis of traffic conditions summarized in the previous Existing Conditions memo, the following critical issues were noted.

- Tierra Linda Middle School (TLMS) generates excessive traffic on the residential oriented street, Dartmouth Avenue.
- Carlmont High School (CHS) and Cranfield Avenue parallel street configuration creates conflicts
- Alameda de las Pulgas (ADLP)-San Carlos Avenue/Cranfield Avenue-Carmont High School intersection warrants enhanced traffic control.
- ADLP/Chula Vista Drive intersection does not currently warrant enhanced traffic control but will operate deficiently with increased traffic in the future.
- ADLP/El Verano Way intersection does not currently warrant enhanced traffic control but will operate deficiently with increased traffic in the future.
- ADLP/Carlmont Drive intersection does currently warrant enhanced traffic control.
- The all-way stop traffic control at the intersections of ADLP/Carlmont Drive, ADLP/El Verano Way and ADLP/Chula Vista Drive are the primary source of congestion on the corridor.

The study area is shown in the attachments.

Alternatives

The following alternatives were evaluated with traffic control features developed to produce the most acceptable traffic operations possible. These alternatives are shown on the attached images.

Access Alternative # 1 – 4 Way Cranfield Intersection

- All all-way stop intersection controls would be removed.

- 4-Way intersection at Cranfield Drive requires a full size roundabout of approximately 120 feet in diameter.
- 4-Way intersection would include new access to TLMS.
- South side of Cranfield intersection would require realignment of CHS and Church access points.
- NE Parcel adjacent to Cranfield roundabout would need to be acquired.
- Intersections with Chula Vista Drive and El Verano Way would be controlled by mini roundabouts.
- NE parcel adjacent to El Verano intersection would need some land acquisition.
- ADLP would include signal at Carlmont Drive.

Access Alternative #2A – Midpoint Access to CHS and TLMS with Traffic Signal

- All all-way stop intersection controls would be removed.
- 4-Way intersection at new access to CHS and TLMS controlled by traffic signal.
- Intersection would include new midpoint access to TLMS through field.
- Intersection would include access to CHS diverted through parking lot.
- ADLP at Cranfield would be restriped with new two-way left-turn lane.
- Access to CHS from Cranfield Avenue would be limited to emergency vehicle access (EVA) only.
- Intersection with Chula Vista Drive would be controlled by side street stop signs.
- Intersection with El Verano Way would be controlled by a traffic signal.
- Traffic signals at San Carlos Avenue/Dartmouth, ADLP/School Access and ADLP/El Verano Way would be coordinated.
- ADLP would include signal at Carlmont Drive.

Access Alternative #2B – Midpoint Access to CHS and TLMS with Roundabout

- All all-way stop intersection controls would be removed.
- 4-Way intersection at new access to CHS and TLMS would be controlled by roundabout
- Intersection would include new midpoint access to TLMS through field
- Intersection would include access to CHS diverted through parking lot.
- ADLP at Cranfield would be restriped with new two-way left-turn lane.
- Access to CHS from Cranfield Avenue would be limited to emergency vehicle access (EVA) only.
- Intersection with Chula Vista Drive would be controlled by mini roundabout
- Intersection with El Verano Way would be controlled by a mini roundabout.
- NE parcel adjacent to El Verano intersection would need some land acquisition.
- ADLP would include signal at Carlmont Drive.

Access Alternative #3A – Midpoint Access to CHS and TLMS with Turn Restrictions

- All all-way stop intersection controls would be removed.
- 4-Way intersection at new access to CHS and TLMS would be restricted to right-turn in and right-turn out only.
- Turn restrictions would be forced by a raised median on ADLP.
- Intersection would include new midpoint access to Tierra Linda Middle School through field
- Intersection would include access to CHS diverted around front of gym.
- ADLP/Cranfield intersection would be controlled by a mini roundabout
- South side of Cranfield intersection would require realignment of CHS and Church access points.
- Access to CHS from Cranfield Avenue would be limited to emergency vehicle access (EVA) only.

- Intersection with Chula Vista Drive would be controlled by mini roundabout
- Intersection with El Verano Way would be controlled by a mini roundabout.
- NE parcel adjacent to El Verano intersection would need some land acquisition.
- ADLP would include signal at Carlmont Drive.

Access Alternative #3B – Offset Midpoint Access to CHS and TLMS with Turn Restrictions


- All all-way stop intersection controls would be removed.
- New access points to CHS and TLMS would be restricted to right-turn in and right-turn out only.
- Turn restrictions would be forced by a raised median on ADLP.
- Offset access may be needed if it not possible to align new access points.
- Intersection would include new midpoint access to TLMS through field.
- Intersection would include access to CHS diverted around front of gym.
- ADLP/Cranfield intersection would be controlled by a mini roundabout
- South side of Cranfield intersection would require realignment of CHS and Church access points.
- Access to CHS from Cranfield Avenue would be limited to emergency vehicle access (EVA) only.
- Intersection with Chula Vista Drive would be controlled by mini roundabout
- Intersection with El Verano Way would be controlled by a mini roundabout.
- NE parcel adjacent to El Verano intersection would need some land acquisition.
- ADLP would include signal at Carlmont Drive.

Design Considerations

- If the ADLP/Cranfield intersection were to be reconfigured as a four legged roundabout intersection with a TLMS access, the roundabout would need to be designed with a larger diameter in the 120-foot range. This larger diameter and the roundabout design needs would require that the single family residence adjacent to the TLMS property be acquired.
- Mini-roundabouts with a smaller 80-foot diameter were considered where applicable. Below is a description of a mini-roundabout.
- If the ADLP/Cranfield intersection were to be reconfigured with a roundabout alignment as a three legged intersection without access to TLMS, a smaller 80 to 90-foot mini roundabout would be applicable. This could be constructed within the existing right-of-way. A schematic design of this mini roundabout version is attached.
- If ADLP/Chula Vista Way were converted to a mini-roundabout, the high school driveway entrance on the south side would need to be slightly re-aligned.
- If ADLP/El Verano Way were converted to a mini-roundabout, a small portion of the empty lot to NE would need to be acquired.
- With the full 4-way roundabout at Cranfield Avenue, the CHS access would need to be realigned with the connection to Cranfield moved further south from its current position. This will present some constructability issues due to the change in grades and may result in a 12 percent grade for the realigned connection.

- With the smaller 3-way roundabout at Cranfield Avenue, the CHS access has been shown to be realigned further to the west. The existing CHS connection at Cranfield Avenue has been shown as an EVA connection only, but would have a grade change of approximately 8 percent.
- The existing pavement width on ADLP between Cranfield Avenue and Chula Vista Drive is approximately 48 feet. If Drop-off/Pick-up shoulders are provided either on one side of the street or both, the existing diagonal parking would need to be removed.

Mini-Roundabouts are small roundabouts with a fully traversable central island. They are most commonly used in low-speed urban environments with average operating speeds of 30 mph or less. They can be useful in such environments where conventional roundabout design is precluded by right-of-way constraints. In retrofit applications, mini-roundabouts are relatively inexpensive because they typically require minimal additional pavement at intersecting roads and minor widening at the corner curbs. (Roundabouts: An Informational Guide, NCHRP Report 672).



Parking

The existing conditions report estimated that CHS currently generates approximately 150 parked vehicles on the streets surrounding the campus. With a potential increase of 300 students, an additional 86 parked vehicles will need to be accommodated. Also, if the Access Alternatives are designed with pick-up/drop off aisles on Alameda de Las Pulgas, the existing 34 diagonal parking spaces would need to be eliminated. Given the deficit of parking supply on the CHS campus, a potential parking lot is shown in the alternatives at the location of the tennis courts. (A single level of parking constructed underneath the tennis courts would net approximately 130 spaces.)

Evaluation Results

The following alternatives were evaluated with traffic control features developed to produce the most acceptable traffic operations possible.

Access Alternative #1 – 4 Way Cranfield Intersection

- All intersections would operate acceptably.
- The westbound queue approaching the new four-way roundabout at Cranfield would extend to Dartmouth Avenue during a very short period in the morning school peak.
- On-street pick-up and drop-off along ADLP could be maximized between Cranfield and Chula Vista.
- Roundabouts would allow for easy return for those dropping off at curbside.
- ADLP between Cranfield Avenue and Chula Vista Drive could either be kept in its current configuration with diagonal parking on the south side, or converted to two travel lanes with Drop-off/Pick-up shoulders on one side or both which would require the removal of the diagonal parking.

Access Alternative #2A – Midpoint Access to CHS and TLMS with Traffic Signal

- All intersections would operate acceptably.
- On-street pick-up and drop-off along ADLP could be provided on both sides of access, but may require students to cross access at some point.
- ADLP between Cranfield Avenue and Chula Vista Drive would need to be converted to two travel lanes plus left-turn pockets to serve turning vehicles at the traffic signal. The three lane section would require removal of the existing diagonal parking. The remaining 7-8 foot shoulder could be used for Drop-off/Pick-up or parallel parking on both sides of the street.

Access Alternative #2B – Midpoint Access to CHS and TLMS with Roundabout

- All intersections would operate acceptably.
- On-street pick-up and drop-off along ADLP could be provided on both sides of access, but may require students to cross access at some point.
- Roundabouts would allow for easy return for those dropping off at curbside.
- ADLP between Cranfield Avenue and Chula Vista Drive could either be kept in its current configuration with diagonal parking on the south side, or converted to two travel lanes with Drop-off/Pick-up shoulders on one side or both which would require the removal of the diagonal parking.

Access Alternative #3A – Midpoint Access to CHS and TLMS with Turn Restrictions

- All intersections would operate acceptably.
- On-street pick-up and drop-off along ADLP could be provided on both sides of access, but may require students to cross access at some point.
- Roundabouts would serve left-turn movements that would be prohibited by raised median.
- Raised median could be used for enhanced pedestrian crossing.
- ADLP between Cranfield Avenue and Chula Vista Drive could either be kept in its current configuration with diagonal parking on the south side except in the area of the median, or converted to two travel lanes with Drop-off/Pick-up shoulders on one side or both which would require the removal of the diagonal parking.

Access Alternative #3B – Offset Midpoint Access to CHS and TLMS with Turn Restrictions

- All intersections would operate acceptably.

- On-street pick-up and drop-off along ADLP could be provided on both sides of access, but may require students to cross access at some point.
- Roundabouts would serve left-turn movements that would be prohibited by raised median.
- Raised median could be used for enhanced pedestrian crossing.
- ADLP between Cranfield Avenue and Chula Vista Drive could either be kept in its current configuration with diagonal parking on the south side except in the area of the median, or converted to two travel lanes with Drop-off/Pick-up shoulders on one side or both which would require the removal of the diagonal parking.


Benefits and Consequences

A summary of each alternative has been weighed based upon its impact to key transportation issues and the benefits and consequences of implementation. The results are shown in the following table.








Alameda de Las Pulgas-San Carlos Avenue Corridor Study
Figure 1 – Study Area and Lane Configurations






