Measure A has made it possible to support high quality education and upgrade our local high schools.

Districtwide Goals:

- Add classrooms, science labs, and schools to support projected growth
- Provide updated classrooms with labs, technology, and Career Technical Education facilities to support educational programs
- Renovate aging classrooms and repair, construct, or acquire equipment, classrooms, and facilities to support delivery of services
- Construct a new alternative small school to meet the diverse needs of our incoming student population

Measure A Funding

at Menlo-Atherton High School:

- New Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math (STEAM) building that includes state-of-theart science, arts, and makerspace classrooms
- New 21 classroom G-wing with a learning center, collaboration rooms, and a grand courtyard
- Expansion of guidance office to accommodate additional counseling services
- Additional food service building and a new set of student restrooms
